A Letter to Prospective Parents:

Many Parents & Students are concerned with the rumors of the time commitment when entering The Eagle Regiment. Well, Marching Band is a commitment, I will not lie about that.

Here's a little more than what I can say in an "official" informational page:

Prior to school starting, we do live and breathe Marching Band, with our Band camp both on Campus and then off campus for a week. But we do that because the academic year has not begun yet, so we try to take advantage of that time as best we can. Once school starts however, our schedule becomes more routine. On Monday's we meet for a short time, the same as one block to go over music. Much of this time is sectionals, and can be flexible based on the academics going on for the students. By the time we reach October, these meetings tend to shorten up, as we know the music pretty well. Additionally, our access to the football field is limited, so we try to make the best use of our time on the field by perfecting our music off of the field. Wednesday Nights are our big rehearsals. This is the only time we have all of our members (There are some non-marching members who join us after-school only) and it is the only evening in which we can practice on the field. When it comes to performances, Home Games & Competitions (Generally Friday's & Saturday's) are the most important. In both of these instances we are performing a full show on the field for our families, fans and judges (in the case of the competitions).

Comparing Eagle Regiment to a sports team's time commitment is valid. Whether it is Marching Band, Football, Basketball, a Drama Production, or Robotics, each ask for between 250-300 outside of school hours per semester (including travel & performance time).

No matter the activities or academics your student is involved in, I can confidently say that we have someone in the band in a similar situation. Here are some activities Eagle Regiment students have participated in, while being enrolled in the Marching Band:

We have students that excel academically, we have students that need the extra study time and make use of the tutoring sessions during X-block. My goal is that the band does not hinder these activities, but in fact enhances them. Since we accept all four grades, someone in every freshman's section has already taken the class the new freshman are taking and can be encouraging and helpful throughout the season. While we do ask the students to commit themselves to the ensemble and the team, we are also aware that these are High School students living a full life outside of the Band Room.

## What is Eagle Regiment? FAQ's

#### What is Eagle Regiment?

- Eagle Regiment is Chaminade's Marching Band.
- It is a Co-Curricular Class, meaning we meet both during the school day and after-school.
- Eagle Regiment is a Fall Semester Course
- Students receive a grade for the class
- Students can receive EITHER 1 semester of Fine Arts Credit OR 1 semester of Physical Education Credit each time the take the course
- Ex. 4 years of Eagle Regiment can result in 2 PE credits & 2 Fine Arts Credits
   If it's a class what is the schedule? (Full Calendar)
  - The Eagle Regiment year begins in June:
    - June:
      - Drum Camp, 3 days with all potential percussionists, learning the basics of each instrument, and being placed on the proper instrument(s) for the full fall season
      - Play nights, All students may attend play nights, scheduled on WEDNESDAY nights (6-8p) throughout June to meet with their section, learn the music and play together

- July/August:
  - The last 2 weeks of July (1st week of August) are reserved for Band Camp. The first 3-4 days are on campus, the final full week is held at The Oaks Camp & Conference Center, Overnights Sunday to Saturday. Time is spent learning proper body motion, marching techniques, breathing techniques etc. Band Camp is Mandatory for all Marching members, as we do begin to learn the halftime show & Pregame routines at Camp. (Cost is usually \$600-\$700 per person, assistance may be available upon request)
- August October:
  - Once school begins, The Band meets in Class during D-Block (7:50am) on Even Days.
  - There are 2 additional outside of school rehearsals:
    - Mondays from 3:15 5:00p (Music only rehearsal)
    - Wednesdays from 6 9p (Music & Field Rehearsal)
  - We perform at all Home & Away Football games (Usually Fridays).
  - We will also march a few Parades & Participate in Marching Band Festival/Competitions (Saturdays)
- November:
  - Marching Band Festivals and our Championship Performance.
    - Championships are an overnight trip, usually costing around \$350/person (Hotel, Food Transportation)

So After Fall Season Eagle Regiment is over?

- Nope. We also play for Home Basketball Games (Only ½ of the band at a time though, so each student only attends games they are assigned to)
- We also continue to march Parades & perform for school pep rallies

But if we don't get a grade for Eagle Regiment in 2nd semester do we really have to continue performing?

 We ask you to honor your commitment to the Band. Also if you are unwilling to honor that commitment, and you do not fulfill your responsibilities by choosing not to perform with the Pep Band or at the Rally's, you will not be allowed to return to the Marching Band in the Fall.

Do I have to be in Wind Ensemble if I am in Eagle Regiment?

 No but it is HIGHLY encouraged so that you can continue playing on a regular basis throughout the year and are prepared for the following years Marching Season.

That sounds like a ton of work. Why should I do that?

The Eagle Regiment is currently the premier ensemble on campus. If you wish to be
involved in the instrumental music program here at Chaminade, the Eagle Regiment is
the centerpiece of the program. Every serious musician and each of the students that
truly enjoy playing their instrument are all in the Eagle Regiment. The Band is a family
and it teach many things other than just music.

## **Marching Band Fees**

This year, each student participating in Marching Band will be charged a \$1,150.00 fee. A payment plan is listed below. That fee includes the following: (individual cost)

In a nutshell, Band Camp is the foundation upon which our entire season is based. The vast majority of the time is spent building the knowledge, not only mentally but physically, of the skills and techniques we will use throughout the year. It is a "build up" process, where the knowledge and skills of today are built upon the successes of the day before. Therefore, attendance is essential for success.

Band Camp exists in three parts; New Member Camp, Band Camp I (at Chaminade) and Band Camp II (at The Oaks). At New Member Camp, held at Chaminade, our first time members, and those who would like some refreshers, are taught the basic concepts of the physical, or visual, part of what we do. This gives them a better preparation for the Band Camp that follows and prepares them for success from day one.

At Band Camp I, the majority of the time is built upon the basics, the skills we use throughout the year. As we move to Band Camp II (The Oaks), we will introduce parts of our marching program, the pregame and halftime performances; giving us a leg up on the year. Our Band Camp II is held at The Oaks Camp and Conference Center in Lake Hughes, CA. We are housed in the cabins and eat in the dining hall. We share the facilities with other summer programs, but the field and rehearsal areas are ours for our time there.

The cost for all of Marching Season is \$1,150 (See what this includes Here). Payment in full is appreciated, but a payment plan has also been set up. If you have financial concerns, please let me know as soon as possible. We have some assistance available. Attached are a basic schedule of the week and a recommended packing list. Following our return from The Oaks, there will be a performance of the skills we've learned and a BBQ held at Chaminade.
